## The Elkhart Historical Society announces the schedule for the April Wildflower walks on Elkhart Hill.

The April wildflower walks will be offered twice a day, 10a or 2p and are scheduled for every Saturday in April starting April 3rd for the very earliest of the spring ephemerals such as spring beauties and Dutchmen's breeches, and later in the season concluding with the vast sweeps of Virginia Bluebells. The final Saturday April 24th will offer two bird walks, 6A and 4p, with a

combination bird and flower walk at 10a. Private tours for groups of 10 or more can be arranged for on other days during the spring bloom. The bird walk will once again be led by a team of fabulous birders, who helped to identify over 60 species of birds on previous walks.
